"The idea behind this piece of work was to show the history of public art but also how it has, and continues to affect contemporary design today.

I started out by showing mans most basic need, to communicate. Cave painting displays this perfectly- early man didn't want just a cave, he wanted a home! This need to decorate and express yourself continues with a look towards early Egyptian art. Here, ideas and thoughts about spiritual life were displayed for all to see.



At the beginning of the 1970's a movement was developed that would change our ideas about what and more importantly where art should be. The age old tradition of expressing yourself found a new lease of life in Hip Hop. This art form was created by, and for young people. We can be whoever we want to be, a chance to freely invent a new persona.

The Hip Hop movement ideas of expressionism, adventure and fun are still alive today.



It's these ideas that are reinstalling themselves in today's design movement. Exciting changes are happening in regards to people's perceptions of what it means to be by yourself, and how you show that.

I hope this painting shows a need that's been alive since the beginning of Man - the need to understand your own existence." Ed Forsyth 2008.

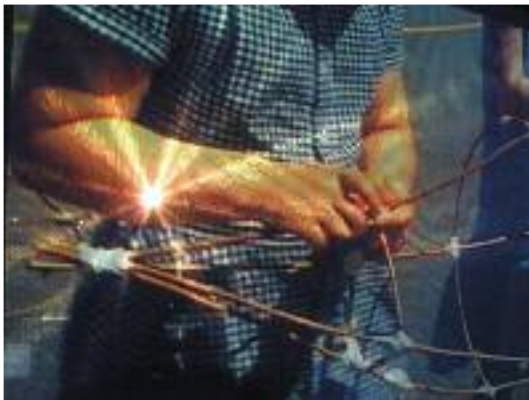
